The YOUTH TRANSITION project is co-financed by the Republic of Slovenia and the European Union from the European Social Fund.



**The YOUTH TRANSITION project aims at solving the problem of high unemployment of young people with special needs.**

During the project period (from January 2018 to December 2021), 14 partners, vocational rehabilitation providers, under the leadership of the project coordinator (Association of Vocational Rehabilitation Providers of the Republic of Slovenia), are cooperating in facilitating the transition of young people with special needs from school to the labour market.

### **The main objective of the YOUTH TRANSITION project is:**

- 1** to influence the greater social inclusion of young people with special needs;
- 2** to contribute to the creation of a supportive environment as an interface between school and the labour market and
- 3** to raise employer awareness and motivate them to employ young people with special needs.

2100 young people with special needs will be served by the YOUTH TRANSITION project.



### **Who is the target group of the YOUTH TRANSITION project?**

The target group is young people with special needs from one of the following categories:

- children with intellectual disabilities,
- blind or visually impaired children,
- deaf or hearing impaired children,
- children with speech impairment,
- physically disabled children,
- chronically ill children,
- children with autistic spectrum disorders, or
- children with emotional or behavioural deficit/disorders

for whom major problems are anticipated during their transition to the labour market and during their employment.
